

\$3,000 in Pet Food Donated to the HSO

On Saturday November 13th the Humane Society of the Ochocos received more than 8,000 lbs. of Attaboy and AttaCat food, products of American Nutrition of Ogden, Utah. According to Janelle Moore, the shelter's manager, this is the third time the Utah based company has selected the Prineville Shelter for a significant donation. Two previous donations have amounted to 14,000 lbs. of dog and cat food.

Powell Butte residents and HSO supporters Curt Burrell and Glenn Hanna have teamed up to deliver the donation. When asked about the connection between the Prineville shelter and American Nutrition, Burrell explained that it goes back several years to when American Nutrition was a sponsor of the 300-mile sled dog race, which was a major event in Central Oregon. According to Burrell, Steve Mills, (current Vice President of Marketing of American Nutrition) took into consideration the incredible hospitality and support the race received from the Prineville community and has chosen to reciprocate by donating to the shelter.

Volunteers from Crook County Search and Rescue and SMAF assisted in storing the food in the shelter's new food storage building. Organized in 1995 to fill a need in Crook County the shelter finds homes for more than 1,200 animals each year.
